WHAT'S HAPPENING?

The Council's draft Local Plan suggests taking Green Belt land for housing and infrastructure – but you can say **NO!**

Respond to the Council's Consultation by 5pm on 28 February 2019

HOW MUCH GREEN BELT COULD BE LOST?

Reports suggest up to 7%.

That's the equivalent of two Durants or Trent Parks, or ten Jubilee, Broomfield or Oakwood Parks. This would include the loss of the Garden Centres at **Crews Hill** and other land that could be better used for outdoor recreation, food-production, wildlife habitat and keeping Enfield clean and green.



WHERE WILL THE HOUSES GO INSTEAD?

A new report shows that there is enough brownfield [used land] to meet realistic housing and infrastructure targets in areas where properly master-planned new development could also bring improved public transport and a better quality of life for residents.

WHAT ARE PEOPLE SAYING?

82% of people who responded to the 2015 consultation said they wanted the Green Belt protected!
