Palmers Green Safer Neighbourhood Team News

Disappointingly burglary had increased again over the month of November. A number of these burglaries or attempts have been in the early hours targeting UPVC doors and windows to check if they have been locked properly. Some properties have been entered by the rear through back doors or patio doors which have been forced or smashed.

Please make sure all doors are double locked overnight.

Unfortunately thefts of vehicles has increased. If you are looking for a Christmas present for the owner of a keyless car maybe a faraday pouch (signal blocker) and a steering lock might be good purchase. High end cars like Range Rovers, Mercedes and BMWs are easy targets if not protected.

It also seems that we've got some light fingered purse and phone thieves operating in Green Lanes at the moment. A number of victims from young to elderly have had purses taken from unzipped or clasped bags or phones snatched from hands while walking or from tables left unattended. Please zip and clasp those bags. Maybe think about not holding or using your phone whilst walking and not leaving your phone unattended on a table or counter. Try not to give the thieves an opportunity.

We've had a number of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incidents reported to us over the last month. Many around drugs or alcohol. We've been patrolling the areas reported to us with some success and some not.

In Chimes Avenue, a couple of weeks ago, three males in a parked car were spoken to resulting in one being arrested as he was wanted for another crime and two being dealt with by community resolution for being found with cannabis on them.

With the assistance of Southgate Green SNT officers two males were stopped and searched in Pilgrims Close

Last week in Franlaw Crescent during after school patrols two males were arrested after being stopped and searched for possession with intent to supply after being found with drugs on them.

We welcomed a new officer, PC Shannon Shears to the team at the end of November. She is at the start of her police career and is looking forward to getting to grips with Palmers Green.

Welcome to the latest Palmers Green Ward Safer Neighbourhoods Newsletter. This edition covers the crime figures on Palmers Green Ward for November 2020.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 140 recorded crimes on the Ward during this period.

Burglary

There was 6 attempted and 14 residential burglaries and 2 shed burglaries during November.

PARK AVENUE, between 2.30pm, 25th October and 11.59pm, 27th October. Property is under renovation. An unknown person has taken a large amount of building supplies stored inside the property.

HUGUENOT DRIVE, between 11.40am and 9.05pm, 4th November. Entry was gained to the first floor patio doors from the balcony. Burglar has climbed up from the rear garden of the ground floor flat and forced opened the doors. Jewellery, cash and watches were taken.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 10.30pm and 10.45pm on 6th November. Unknown female has pressed a number of flat numbers and a resident has let her in. She has then gone to the living and kitchen and taken items before leaving.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 9.30pm, 7th November and 11.10pm, 8th November. An unknown female has pressed a number of the intercom buzzers and no one let her in. She walked away before coming back and this time a resident has let her in. She has gone to the communal lounge and kitchen and came out with a bag with items in. She has left the building near the garden and used the back gate. She returned again on Sunday 8th November at 1108pm.

HAZELWOOD LANE, between 12pm, 9th November and 9.34am, 10th November. Bicycle shed door was forced open and a locked bicycle was taken from inside.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 3.30pm, 9th November and 12.20pm, 10th November. Gardens shed was broken open and power tools and two bicycles taken.

HEDGE LANE, between 11am and 1.30pm, 10th November. A male has entered the porch and elbowed through the stained glass of the front door, cracking the glass and bending the lead. Entry was not gained to either flat.

HEDGE LANE, between 10pm, 10th November and 1.30pm, 12th November. Burglar has climbed over the side fence from Munster Gardens into the victim's rear garden and tried to force open the back door with a tool. No entry was gained.

HAZELWOOD LANE, 11am, 13th November. Burglar has smashed the small pane of glass next to the communal door to lean in and open the door and then tried to force open the flat door before being disturbed and making off leaving behind two screwdrivers wedge in the door. He then returned to retrieve them before running off.

LODGE MANSIONS PARADE, GREEN LANES, between 3pm and 4.40pm, 14th November. Kitchen window was forced open. IPad and laptop were taken.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 10.48pm, 30th October and 8.45pm 15th November. A further three times during the above period a female suspect has gained access to the building by pressing a number of resident's bells until someone lets her in. She has then gone to the communal lounge and kitchen and taken items from this area.

RIVER AVENUE, 9.53pm on 20th November. The owners were upstairs when they heard a bang. On opening the front door they have found the porch door forced open and an unknown person running away towards Green Lanes.

THE LARCHES, 5.05am, 16th November. One male is seen to push the porch door handle down to confirm it wasn't locked. Short time later two males open the porch door and attempt to force open the main door before being disturbed and running off slamming the porch door behind them.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, between 12pm and 8.40pm, 21st November. Rear garden door was forced open and an untidy search found. Jewellery and cash were taken.

GREEN LANES, 12.50pm, 21st November. Two males got through the communal door with a

plank of wood and began banging on the victim's door before going into the garden. No entry was gained to any of the flats.

CHEAPSIDE NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, between 5am and 5pm, 23rd November. Victim's room door in a shared house has been forced open and money taken from her bag.

ULSTER GARDENS, between 5.15pm and 5.23pm, 23rd November. Entry was gained over the rear or side fence and the rear door was forced open. Untidy search of the house was found and jewellery taken.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, between 5.20pm and 5.35pm, 25th November. The victim confronted two males found in her garden after they smashed the rear garden door. They made off over the fence.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, between 9am and 8pm, 25th November. Garden door was forced open and an untidy search of the house found. Jewellery was taken.

NEW PARK AVENUE, 4.33am, 26th November. Two males were seen on CCTV walking along the street and one tried the front door handle to see if it was double locked before walking away.

DORCHESTER AVENUE, between 6am, and 6.05am, 26th November. Entry to the property was via the rear door. Possibly left insecure. Laptops were taken from the ground floor. Victims were asleep upstairs.

HAZELWOOD LANE, between 7.55pm and 7.56pm, 28th November. Entry into the rear garden was over the fence. The rear patio door which was possibly left insecure was the entry point into the house as there was no sign of forced entry. Jewellery was taken.

Motor Vehicle Crime

There were 16 thefts from motor vehicles and 9 thefts of motor vehicles reported in November.


RIVERWAY, between 2pm, 30th October and 4pm, 1st November. Front and rear number plates taken

TRADE CLOSE, 5-5.30pm, 1st November. Rear number plate taken.

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it.

Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door handle goes down when tried and is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of triangular metal going into the frame. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effort.

GREEN LANES, 10.10-10.15pm. While the victim was distracted an unknown male jumped into the car and drove it off.

ALDERMANS HILL, 12.25-1250pm, 4th November. Catalytic converter taken from a Honda Accord.

CONNAUGHT GARDENS, between 11am, 3rd November and 7pm, 4th November. Honda Accord taken from location.

THE LARCHES, 2.20-2.33pm, 6th November. Ford Transit taken from location.

THE LARCHES, between 9pm, 5th November and 9am, 6th November. Catalytic converter taken from Honda CRV.

THE FAIRWAY, 3.43-3.46pm, 8th November. Range Rover taken from location without keys possibly via relay attack.

NEW RIVER CRESCENT, between 5pm, 7th November and 7.10am, 9th November. Spare tyre taken from underneath a van.

Morrisons Car Park ALDERMANS HILL, 11.55am-12.45pm, 9th November. Catalytic converter taken from a Honda Civic.

LODGE DRIVE CAR PARK, 1.15-1.50pm, 9th November. Catalytic converter taken from a Honda CRV.

NEW PARK AVENUE, 10.20-10.30am, 12th November. Catalytic converter taken from a VW Polo.

November. Motorbike was taken from location.
Later recovered from Wood Green by the victim.

RIVER AVENUE, 6.25-6.30pm, 18th November. Car was entered and everything was emptied from the glove box. Unknown if anything was taken.

FARNDALE AVENUE, between 8.10pm, 18th November and 11.50am, 19th November. Mercedes taken from location.

Morrisons Car Park, ALDERMANS HILL, 4-4.30pm, 21st November. Catalytic converter taken from a Honda Civic.

PARKSIDE TERRACE, CAMBRIDGE ROAD, between 5.30pm, 19th November and 1.30pm, 22nd November. Car was entered and searched through including the boot. Car's manual was taken.

ALDERMANS HILL, between 8pm, 22nd
November and 2pm, 23rd November. The victim
left her car and keys behind after having a drink.
On returning the car was not there. Car has since been recovered and returned to the victim after a stop by police.

He handed over his bicycle and the two males continued on the New River footpath.
