As we all rush towards the biggest gift giving day of the year. Please take care with those last minute parcel deliveries. If possible be in for your delivery. If not think about other options like an off-site locker for frequent deliveries and expensive items. Rearrange deliveries or leave with a neighbour if you won' be home. Install a video doorbell or security light like a dawn till dusk light to deter thieves.

There are a number of ways to property your property. One way is via property marking and using Smartwater.

Don't forget to mark your new products after Christmas.

Don't publisize this year's gifts. Make sure packaging is out of sight inside your bin.

Another way to protect your property is by setting up an account with www.immobilise.com and registering your property. Anything that has a serial number can be added to your property list. Which then in turn helps police get stolen property back to its owner.

Good gifts to get those keyless car owners are a good quality steering lock and a faraday pouch or box. Don't forget to get two faraday pouches, one for your everyday key and one for the spare.

A good quality tracker as well as the manufacturer's tracker is a good idea too. Please make sure if you have a manufacturer's tracker fitted that it is activated. It can be too late in some cases after a car has been stolen.

There is a possibility that thieves are now using another access point to steal keyless cars via the on-board diagnostics port (OBD). So consider purchasing a car port lock. What is a car port lock? It is an extremely strong metal protective cap which prevents access to the OBD port. Without your coded key, the OBD protector is impossible to remove without damaging the plug and the wiring. No OBD access, means no electronic bypass of the vehicle by the thief.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 00 reported allegations of crime on Palmers Green Ward during this period.

Burglary

There were 3 residential burglaries during November.

DEVONSHIRE ROAD, between 5.30pm, 11th November and 9.30am, 12th November. A house being renovated had builders tools take from inside. Access may have been gained through a front insecure window and possibly exited the house via the front door and also taken the wheelie bin.

ULLESWATER ROAD, on 14th November at 3am. Front door was forced open and six males ran up the stairs. One then shouted it's not the right one and they all ran back down the stairs and out the door on to Conway Road. No search was completed and nothing was taken.

BAYSWATER CLOSE, on 25th November, 6.15-6.30pm. The informant disturbed a possible burglar in the garden who was possibly trying to get in the flat there or the

CONWAY ROAD, on 25th November, discovered at 6.45pm. A flat has been entered while the victim was not home and the unknown person has taken jewellery and some presents. No signs of forced entry at the communal entrance. No signs of forced entry to the flat.

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it.

Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.



PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door handle goes down when tried and is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of triangular metal going into the frame. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effort

ALDERMANS HILL, on 2nd November, 12.30-1.02pm. The front grill was taken from a Mercedes.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, on 3rd November at 10.42pm. A catalytic converter taken from a Honda Jazz. Males drove off in a VW towards Green Lanes.

ALDERMANS HILL, on 9th November, 10.45-11.15am. A catalytic converter taken from a 2014 Toyota.

NEW RIVER CRESCENT, 9pm, 11th November – 6am, 12th November. A car was entered and £30 in cash and an ID photo card for a business was taken.

RIVERWAY, on 13th December, 1-5am. A car was entered and a blue badge was taken.

THE GROVE, 6pm, 13th November – 10am, 14th November. A car has been entered and a blue badge taken.
