Welcome to the latest Palmers Green Ward Safer Neighbourhoods Newsletter. This edition covers the crime figures on Palmers Green Ward for October 2022.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 104 reported allegations of crime on Palmers Green Ward during this period.

Burglary

There was 1 attempted residential burglary and 3 residential burglaries during October.

HARLECH ROAD, on 30th September between 3.53pm and 4.10pm. The burglar tried a few other houses first before ringing the victim's doorbell a number of times. When there was no answer he went to the side and then over the side gate. The wooden rear door was forced open to gain entry to the house. The bedrooms were searched and jewellery was taken. The kitchen cupboards were also looked through.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, on 1st October at 12pm. The victim returned to her bedsit flat within a large house and found there was damage to the door.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 7.50am and 10.45am on 11th October. The burglar has entered the rear garden and opened a sash window which may not have been locked to gain entry to the flat. Watches and Cufflinks were taken.

Motor Vehicle Crime

There were 7 thefts from motor vehicles and 9 thefts of motor vehicles reported in October.


ALDERMANS HILL, on 1st October, 6.30-6.35pm. A van was entered and the contents were

NEW RIVER CRESCENT, on 18th October at 4pm. An air vent within the bathroom window was smashed allowing the suspect to lean through and open the window. The front bedroom door lock was forced open and an untidy search completed. Money boxes were found open on the bed. Unknown if anything was taken.

THE RISE, on 21st October at 4.19pm. An unknown person has smashed the side window and a door has been smashed and forced open. Unknown if suspects gained entry.

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it.

Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.



PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door handle goes down when tried and is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of triangular metal going into the frame. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effor

scattered over the floor nearby. A number of tools were taken to the value of £1285.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, on 1st October, 6pm-11.45am, 2nd October. A car was entered and searched through. Unknown if anything was taken.

GREEN LANES, on 1st August, 9am (reported 4th October) A 2003 Jeep Grand Cherokee was left

parked at the rear of a property of which the owner didn't realise was private land and the land was then sold and his vehicle removed by unknown persons.

THE GROVE, on 4th October, 11.15am-12.45pm— A BMW X5 was taken from the location without keys.

LODGE DRIVE car park, on 6th October, 3.25-3.28pm. The victim got into this car after putting his brief case in the boot. Another car drew up behind and a male got out and opened the victim's boot and took the brief case before driving off out of the car park.

THE GROVE, on 14th October, 3am. A car was entered and cash was taken from the passenger area and a guitar from the boot.

CONWAY ROAD, on 15th October, 10.30-10.35pm. A hole was drilled in the door of a van to gain entry and tools were taken.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, on 18th October, 4.43pm. A car was entered after possibly been left open. Unknown if anything was taken.

OLD PARK ROAD, between 12.01am, 3rd
October and 1pm, 18th October. A 2012 BMW M5 was taken from the location without keys.

HAZELWOOD LANE, between 8.15pm, 24th October and 7.30am, 25th October. A 2014 Hyundai was taken from the location without keys.

GROVELANDS ROAD, between 11pm, 25th October and 10.30am, 26th October. A 2017 Volvo XC90 was taken from the location without keys.

DERWENT ROAD, 10am-11.30am on 26th October. A van was entered and tools were taken.

PILGRIMS CLOSE, between 7pm, 27th October and 7.10am, 28th October. A 2012 BMW Sport was taken from the location without keys.

RIVERWAY, 2.15am-3.15am, 29th October. A 2018 Toyota Prius was taken from the location without keys.

GREEN LANES, 3pm-3.10pm on 31st October. 2013. A Honda PCX moped was taken from the location without keys. The moped was found behind a building nearby with damage to the ignition and recovered by the owner.

Robbery and personal theft

There was 2 robberies and 5 personal thefts reported during the past month.

OAKTHORPE ROAD, on 13th October at 9.30pm. The victim went to the location to collect a parcel from a courier. He pulled up to the van and collected his parcel and walked back towards his car. As he did a white car pulled up and a male asked what he had in his parcel and exited the car with a screwdriver in his hand. Another male exited the vehicle and said to hand over the bag or he would get shot and the third male joined them. The victim tried to put the parcel back in the van and the suspects grabbed all of the parcels from the back of the van and got back into their car and drove off.

GREEN LANES, on 30th October, 9.20am-9.30am. The victim was using a cash machine when a male shoved him aside telling him to stop as his wife's card had been swallowed by the machine. The victim kept trying to stop the male and push him aside as the male pressed buttons on the machine and then eventually left taking the victim's wife's bank card. The card had been used at various places before being stop to the total of £888 including £500 of cash.

GREEN LANES, on 7th October, 11am-11.14am. A phone was snatched from the victim's hand by two males on bicycles.

GREEN LANES, on 13th October at 11am. The victim went to the bank in Edmonton and took out cash and got on the W6 bus to go home. When leaving the bus she noticed her bag was open. Cash and other paperwork were taken as they were in an envelope like the cash.

GREEN LANES, on 17th October, 4pm-4.17pm. The victim's wallet was taken while in a shop from her bag when she was shopping.

GREEN LANES, on 22nd October. The victim was in a shop when someone brushed past and she then noticed that her purse and contents were gone from her bag.

NORTH CIRCULAR ROAD, on 27th October, 5.05pm-5.10pm. The victim was asked questions by a female suspect about the buses while waiting at a bus stop and was putting his phone away in an outside pocket in his rucksack at the same time. He then got on the bus and when he got off at North Mid Hospital found his rucksack was open and his phone was gone
