Welcome to the latest Palmers Green Ward Safer Neighbourhoods Newsletter. This edition covers the crime figures on Palmers Green Ward for December 2022.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 81 reported allegations of crime on Palmers Green Ward during this period.

Burglary

There were 4 residential burglaries during December.

PILGRIMS CLOSE, between 4pm and 7pm on 5th December. Entry was possibly via the rear bedroom window which may have been left insecure. Money was taken.

ELMDALE ROAD, on 13th December at approximately 1am. An unknown person has entered the victim's locked room and taken the food from the fridge.

CONWAY ROAD, between 6.45pm and 7pm on 21st December. An unknown person has smashed the glass in the stained glass of the front door. No signs of further entry.

Motor Vehicle Crime

There were 7 thefts from motor vehicles and 7 theft of motor vehicles reported in December.

BROOMFIELD LANE, between 10.10pm and 10.26pm, 1st December. A car was entered and a blue badge taken from the glove compartment.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 2.30am and 3am, 2nd December. A catalytic converter taken from a BMW.

OSBORNE ROAD, between 2am and 4am, 6th December. A 2018 Nissan Juke was taken from

THE GROVE, between 11.59pm, 23rd December and 8.30am, 30th December. Front ground floor window was forced open. iPad and designer handbag including contents, bank cards, and driving licence and house keys were taken.

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it.

Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.



PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door handle goes down when tried and is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of triangular metal going into the frame. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effort

PARK AVENUE, between 10pm, 6th December and 9.30am, 7th December. A Ford Fiesta was taken from the location without keys. The car was involved in a collision in NW10 and was recovered to the car pound.

CROTHALL CLOSE, between 11am, 8th December and 10.20am, 9th December. A 2018 Lexus was taken from the location without keys. Possibly using diagnostic port.

SHAPLAND WAY, on 14th December at 5.05pm. A van was entered and tools were taken.

CROTHALL COURT, between 12.01am, 17th December and 5pm, 18th December. A 2020 Lexus was taken from the location without keys.

ECCLESBOURNE GARDENS, between 5pm and 7pm on 21st December. A number plate was taken from a vehicle.

THE GROVE, between 11.15am, 21st December and 12pm, 22nd December. A 2019 Nissan Juke was taken from the location without keys.

GREEN LANES, between 1.50pm and 5pm, 22nd December. Tools were taken a vehicle.

DEVONSHIRE ROAD, between 10pm, 20th December and 1.15pm, 23rd December. A 2020 Hyundai was taken from the location without keys. Car was found in N18 and retrieved by owner.

THE GROVE, between 12pm, 24th December and 3.30pm, 27th December. A car was entered and a blue badge was taken.

ALDERMANS HILL, between 4.55pm and 5.10pm, 28th December. The side door of a van was drilled to open the door. Tools were taken the back.

DEVONSHIRE ROAD, between 1am, 28th December and 8.55am, 29th December. A 2021 Toyota CHR was taken from the location without keys.

There was 2 robberies and 0 personal thefts reported during the past month.

HEDGE LANE, between 12.38pm and 1.26pm on 7th December. After getting money from the bank which was placed in an envelope the victim walked home. A male and a female tapped him on the shoulder on the way and said there was blood on his jacket which turned out to be tomato sauce. They have then run across the road and jumped on a bus. Appears it was a distraction to take the envelope as it was gone afterwards.

GREEN LANES, on 17th December at 5.35pm. Three males have stopped him while driving and dragged him out of the car and driven off in his car.

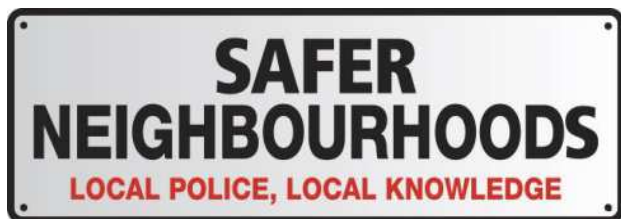
