How To Protect Keyless Entry Cars

10 Ways to Prevent Keyless Car Theft

- 1. Put your keys in a signal blocking pouch

- Turn off keyless entry on your fob
 Steering wheel lock or alarm
 Consider outdoor motion detectors/CCTV
- Store keys away from entry points
 Position your car securely
 Keep the inside of your car tidy
 Consider etching your windows

- 9. Have your keys reprogrammed
- 10. Consider fitting a immobiliser

If you are a keyless car owner, a must purchase is a faraday pouch and a faraday box, and a good quality steering lock. Please then think about purchasing a ghost immobiliser, a third party tracker and a diagnostic port lock.

A stolen vehicle is likely to be parked up for a period of time to determine if there is a tracker fitted. There has been a good success of

recovery when a tracker is fitted manufacturer or third party. It may be wise to fit a third party tracker as well as the manufacturers.

Thieves are also using the diagnostic port to take cars especially if there is an external port. They can fool your car by plugging a device into it that it is your key and so open it and start it and drive it away. Speak to your car manufacturer to find out if yours is vulnerable.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 94 reported allegations of crime on Palmers Green Ward during this period.

Burglary

There was 2 attempted residential burglaries and 2 residential burglaries during June.

SHAPLAND WAY, between 3pm, 10th May and 5am, 12th May (reported in June). A parcel was delivered and left in the communal area and photographed by the driver and wasn't there when the victim returned home. Unknown person had taken it.

GROVELANDS ROAD, on 8th June at 2.15am. The front door window was smashed and tool marks were found on the outside of the door frame.

PILGRIMS CLOSE, on 20th June at 2am. The suspects entered through the insecure communal door and forced entry to the flat. All rooms appear to have been searched including the attic storage space. Unknown if anything was taken.

Motor Vehicle Crime

There were 4 thefts from motor vehicles and 4 theft of motor vehicles reported in June.

GREEN LANES, on 7th June between 5am and 4pm. A 2011 Honda moped was taken without keys.

BARROWELL GREEN, on 11th June between 5.30pm and 7.40pm. A 2018 Nissan Juke was taken without keys.

GREEN LANES/BROOMFIELD LANE, on 22nd June between 10.50am and 11.15am. A 2019

ULLESWATER ROAD, on 20th June at 4.21pm. After a large bang the victim discovered damage to the front door and frame. No entry was gained.

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it. Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.



PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door handle goes down when tried and is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of triangular metal going into the frame. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effort

Ford Transit. A van side door was drilled and £2000 worth of tools were taken.

RIVERWAY, on 22nd June between 8pm and 10am. A 2019 Peugeot 207. Number plates were taken from a vehicle.

WINDSOR ROAD between 5pm, 23rd June and 8.30am, 24th June. A 2019 Mercedes Vito van was taken without keys.

THE RISE, between 3.44am and 4.44am on 23rd June. A 2021 Toyota C-HR was taken without keys.

PALMERSTON CRESCENT, between 12.25am and 12.35am on 26th June. A 2014 Honda NC750 motorbike was taken without keys. The security chain was cut to the ground anchor. Involved in an RTC and recovered to the pound.

RIVERWAY, between 11.59pm, 29th June and 8am, 30th June. A 2014 Vauxhall Saphira was entered and a bag with a key for their roof box and a dash cam were also taken.

Robbery and personal theft

There were 2 robberies and 1 personal theft reported during the past month.

Broomfield Park BROOMFIELD LANE, on 9th June at 8.20am. The two victims walked down Cannon Hill from the Cherry Tree and into the park at the top of Aldermans Hill. When they were on the footpath towards Broomfield Lane two male suspects approached them and asked what phones they had on them. They searched one of the victims and then the other victim's bag. When the second victim then said he was going to call the police they threw the bag at him and ran off.

GREEN LANES, on 13th June at 10.55am. The suspect followed the victim into a shop. When the victim tried on a dress the suspect searched the

victim's bag and the victim caught her doing it and the suspect fled. On checking her bag the victim has found the £600 she'd got out of the bank had gone.

GREEN LANES, between 1am and 2am, 24th June. The victim had been out with friends and used an alleyway to relieve himself. He was then approached by two males from the other end and one put his hand in the victim's pocket and pulled out his wallet and phone. The victim resisted and the suspect punched him in the head three times. The victim fell to the floor and the suspects ran off.

GREEN LANES, on 26th June at 11.30am. The victim had been to the bank and withdrew £5000 for his daughter. He then went shopping where he noticed he was being watched by a female suspect who looked like she was pregnant. She followed him out of the store and down the road where she stopped him and asked him for directions. He then started feeling dizzy and believes this is when the suspect took the money from his pocket.
