How safe do you think it is to cross your road?

"What's this all about?"

The Council is aware that residential streets in your neighbourhood carry a lot of through traffic. Some of this traffic will have legitimate reasons such as deliveries or accessing premises, however some traffic is "rat running" through the area to avoid busy junctions or routes.

In order to improve road safety and encourage walking and cycling the Council would like to reduce through traffic and encourage sensible speeds and we want your help to do this.

Your area is made up of a number of residential streets totalling approximately 8,000 properties. As you can imagine areas this large have many problems that residents are more aware of than the Council. We want to know

- One month, with kit.








Complementary measures

- Dr Bike: sessions at two locations, once per month at each.
- Sunday bike rides: once per month, rotate through four different start locations.
- Cycle maintenance classes: once per month, £18 (subsidised by £27).
- Full range of cycle training, including 1-2-1 lessons for children aged 10 and above





Cycle Enfield Headline schemes

- A1010 (Hertford Road Fore Street)










Main Road Cycle Route





- Parking and Loading demand along all main routes including off-street car parks (Weekday & Weekend)
- Journey time surveys at key town centre locations (Enfield Town/Edmonton Green)
- Town centre questionnaires (Weekday & Weekend)
- Local business questionnaires
