Palmers Green Safer Neighbourhood Team News

Burglary was down again in August and one less than last year. Now the school holidays are over and we are heading towards Halloween, Bonfire Night and Christmas it's time to start thinking about adjusting or purchasing some timer switches for your lights as the nights draw in again. It also has begun to get a bit cooler so check your windows are shut properly and locked. With the dark nights approaching please check to see all your security lights are working.

The catalytic converter thieves have again been active, again going for the Honda Jazz and Toyota Auris with one VW Polo.

Thefts of motor vehicle have seen the biggest increase during the year and there were more than thefts from motor vehicles. The majority seem to be older vehicles. A steering lock is a good purchase for all vehicles.

There have been a few thefts of property on the street. One lady was walking down Hedge Lane using her phone when a male snatched it from her hand and jumped into a car and drove off and another had a purse taken from her bag. On Shapland Way a female riding a bike snatched a bag off another's arm as she rode past. Please be aware of your surroundings when using your phone or carrying your bag when on the street. It also seems the cash thieves are back again as an elderly lady had an envelope of cash taken from her bag whilst standing in the queue in The Post Office.

There are a couple of men mostly described as Asian approaching elderly blue badge holders in Lodge Drive Car Park and telling them they should have registered their badges when parking and they now have to go to Palmers Green Station Car Park to put their card in the machine to avoid a large fine. All the victims have then let the men in their cars and driven them to the Station Car Park and put their cards and PIN in the parking machine only to have the machine swallow their cards. One victim lost a number of cards and had thousands taken from his accounts. Please warn elderly relatives and neighbours to read the car park instructions and not listen to the helpful scammers.

After reports of drug use and or dealing in the alleyways behind Green Lanes during a patrol a couple of weeks ago your ward officers came across two men with a large bag of cannabis. The men were arrested for possession with intent to supply.

Crimes Recorded this month

There were 115 recorded crimes on the Ward during this period.

Burglary

There was 6 residential burglaries and 2 attempted residential burglaries this month.

DAVEY CLOSE, between 8am and 3pm on 1st August. A pram was taken from the locked communal area of flats.

NEW PARK AVENUE, between 2am and 2.25am on 3rd August. Two men on bicycles approached the house. One kept watch while the other threw a brick at a ground floor front window, smashing it and reached through and undid the window. The men were then disturbed by neighbours turning lights on and rode off.

FIRS LANE, between 3pm, 7th August and 4pm, 8th August. A rear patio door was smashed and the house untidily searched. Cash and jewellery were taken.

FIRS LANE, at 1.36pm on 5th August. A pane of glass in a UPVC front door was smashed and the door forced to gain entry. The burglars exited via a rear first floor bedroom window when disturbed. The alarm box was removed from the front of the house, possibly from the front first floor bedroom window.

GREEN LANES, between 2am and 1pm on 8th August. Communal door lock was found to have been broken. No forced entry was made to any of the flats.

LODGE DRIVE, between 2pm and 5pm on 17th August. Communal door possibly left unlocked has been entered by an unknown person and a bicycle was taken.

HEDGE LANE, between 2.30am and 2.45am on 20th August. An unknown man

has attempted to force open a flat door leaving holes in the door. He ran off when confronted by the occupants.


HEDGE LANE, between 5.30pm and 10pm on 22nd August. A woman distracted the victim while the victim was in her front garden doing some gardening and an unknown person has entered the open front door. The victim's bedroom has been searched and her bank card taken along with some cash.

LIFT - LOCK – REMOVE

Please remember to double lock your front doors whether you have a UPVC door or have a Yale and mortice. If you also have a UPVC porch door then double lock that too. If you have the security installed, then please use it.

Please also consider the use of timer switches to light your houses up after dark if you are not yet home.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE LOCKING A UPVC (THREE OR FIVE POINT LOCKING SYSTEM) DOOR.

If a UPVC door is not locked with a key the door is left very weakly secure with a very small piece of metal keeping it secure. This point on the doorframe near the lock is where the suspects target with their screwdrivers or crowbars and can pop your door open sometimes with very little effort.

Motor Vehicle Crime

There were 13 thefts from motor vehicles and 15 thefts of motor vehicles reported in August.

THE ROWANS, between 9pm, 1st August and 9.48am, 2nd August. Front and rear number plates were taken from a car.

CONNAUGHT GARDENS, between 12.01am, 5th August and 12.01am, 27th August. Van was parked on Connaught Gardens near Hazelwood Lane while the victim was on holiday. Bumper and spare wheel had been taken on owner's return.

HEDGE LANE, between 3.20am and 3.30am on 30th August. Van was entered via the passenger door and tools were taken from back.

Robbery

There were 4 robberies reported in August.

Near Morrisons, **ALDERMANS HILL**, at 5pm on 3rd August. The victim was approached on the footbridge on Aldermans Hill by three boys who approached him from behind. He was slapped around the face and instructed to hand over his possessions. He handed over a small amount of change but not his phone. The boys walked off towards Broomfield Park.

FIRS LANE, at 10pm on 27th August. The victim was in his car with two friends when a black car pulled up behind and a number of men got out and approached his car. One asked about the victim's watch and another suspect took the keys from the ignition through the open window. The victim and his friends got out the car and were chased away by the threat of violence. The suspects got into his car and drove it off along with the black car. The victim's iPhone was also in his car.

CONNAUGHT GARDENS, at 8pm on 28th August. The victims were approached by five males in a black car who took threatened them with violence when they refused to give them a chain. The victims' phones, a jacket and the chain were then taken.

NEW PARK AVENUE, at 1 am on 31st August. The victims have been parked and sitting in their car when a car parked near them on the same

road. As the victims have walked towards their front door three men have got out of the other car wearing balaclavas and approached them and telling them to hand over the keys and threatening violence. The victim have thrown the car keys and run up the drive to the house. The males have driven off the victim's car along with the car they arrived in.

Keep your valuables safe

- Burglars will look to steal anything from phones and laptops to jewellery, antiques and cash. Don't leave these or any keys on show or somewhere a burglar may find easily.
- Try not to keep large amounts of cash at home. Consider setting up direct debits or standing orders for any regular payments.
- · If you have particular valuables or items of sentimental value in your home, consider keeping them inside a safe bolted to the floor or wall and not on display itself.
- · Photograph and property mark your valuables with a forensic solution such as SmartWater. You can find out if you are eligible for a free pack by visiting: www.met.police.uk/mettrace

Many people we visit are asking for ID when we visit them. However, would you know what a real Met Police warrant card looks like?

The one BELOW is the real one. Check for the hologram on the warrant card, and the signature of the Commissioner NOT the holder.
